SUMMER CYBER SECURITY

Summer is full of travel, sun, and fun. However, traveling over such a busy season leaves you vulnerable to cyber-attacks if you don't take precautions. This summer, avoid cyber-attacks by following this guide.

1.Never Use Public Wi-Fi

Public Wi-Fi leads to unexpected cyber-attacks. Hackers can gain access to information through the connection. To avoid cyberattack, consider encryption. "Stick to apps with proper encryption, and if you only use websites with URLs that start 'https://', short for "secure HTTP". This scrambles the data before it leaves your laptop or phone, and (in theory) only unscrambles it after it reaches the other end." (Naked Security). This way, hackers can't access your data through wireless connection. Alternatively, use mobile hotspots and private networks to avoid public network cyber-attacks.





2. Beware of Phishing While on Vacation

Phishing is when a cyber-criminal poses as a legitimate source either through email, text, or phone call and tries to get you to divulge sensitive information. Always check the address or number to verify whether the source is legitimate. Check for spelling errors and other formatting discrepancies. This could be a clue that it is a phishing message. "For added protection, consumers can also download security protection such as Lookout, which can monitor and identify URL scams in email and text messages as well as on the internet." (Travel Pulse). Links can be malicious, so never click on them. Cyber hygiene is the best way to avoid phishing scams.

3. Pack Up & Back Up Everything Before You Go

Make sure that your data is properly stored before you leave home this summer. This prevents cyber criminals from performing ransomware, and also ensures that nothing is lost while you're away. "Backing everything up reliably before you set off also means you are free to strip down the amount of digital content you keep loaded on your devices, and thus to reduce the quantity of data you might have to declare or reveal at a border crossing." (Naked Security). This means your travels will be less stressful.



4. Encryption



Encrypting your data is the best way to prevent cyber-attacks. Its essential that your lock code is sufficient to keep hackers out and prevent them from accessing your data. "Pick a nice, long lock code (we recommend 10 digits or more, and we don't mean 00000 00000 or 12345 12345), and practice using it regularly for a few days before you leave, until you can remember it easily." (Naked Security). This way, your data will be locked away safely and won't be vulnerable during travel.

5. Do Your Research

Make sure that the destination you are heading to doesn't have any requirements regarding your data. Some requirements include the types of data you can bring into the destination. "Prepare yourself before you go by checking up on the entry requirements of anywhere you're planning to visit." (Naked Security). Don't bring all of your devices or data with you anywhere you go either.
